Message from Mrs. Lowrey

We have had such a fantastic week at Holywell, getting fully back in the swing of things! Some of you may have seen the article in the newspaper or on Devon live regarding the return to school – if not, please do check it out! The report in the North Devon Gazette was fantastic to read and always makes me so proud!

Today, again, we are full of pride for our children representing the school. We were so pleased to take 12 Year 5/6 children to Park School for the athletics festival and I am delighted to say that our school came joint 2^{nd} or 3^{rd} – depending on how you interpret the results! (There was a joint first place and then we shared the next position with our friends at Orchard Vale!) Behaviour was excellent and I was so proud to hear how well they competed – excellent, as always, children!

This week, we have focused our collective worship on our school value of kindness. We have spent time talking to the children about how we "Let our Light Shine". Our school values are rooted theologically in Matthew 5 outlined below:

¹⁴ Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid.

¹⁵ Neither do men light a candle, and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house.

¹⁶ Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.

We then developed our values trying to think about how we let our lights shine and what values help us to demonstrate our good work. We have added in honesty as part of our value system to help us to understand the authenticity of which we try to grow.

This week, it was an absolute pleasure to hear the children singing new songs about kindness and giving individual awards for children who have really demonstrated kindness this week – well done children!

Attendance

Now that we are settled and back into our typical Holywell expectations, I thought it timely to refocus our attention to school attendance. I have noticed a huge improvement over the years in our punctuality and children are arriving increasingly on time and even early, which is fantastic. I am sharing information on school attendance for your information as there has been a shift in quidance for parents and schools over time and I am wanting to keep you fully informed.

This table has been shared for you to see how your child's percentage for attendance can have This table will give you a clear understanding of what your child's percentage means:

Attendance during one school year	Equivalent days absent	Equivalent weeks absent	Number of lessons missed
95%	9	≈ 2 weeks	≈ 48
90%	19	≈ 4 weeks	≈ 96
85%	29	≈ 6 weeks	≈ 144
80%	38	≈ 8 weeks	≈ 192
75%	48	≈ 10 weeks	≈ 240
70%	57	≈ 11 weeks	≈ 276

such a big impact on the learning that is missed. The department for education set the national expectation for attendance at anything above 96%; even at this percentage, this is 7 days missed in a school year.

Over the course of this term, we will be sending out some letters which are designed to monitor children's attendance and we want to make sure that you are fully informed on this. Of course, I understand that children can be unwell and some children need to attend appointments and I would <u>always</u> encourage you to take the time to recover and attend as necessary. It can, however, be very easy to be unaware how much learning has been missed, so please do not be offended if you receive a letter regarding attendance, we simply want to work together to make sure that your child is supported to attend as regularly as possible.

Free school meals

If you're struggling to pay food bills, we encourage you to check your eligibility and apply for free school meals for your child.

All children in reception, year 1 and year 2 at state schools in England automatically get free school meals. From year 3 onwards, just children whose parents are receiving certain benefits are entitled to free school meals during term time. However, parents are encouraged to apply for free school meals when they enrol their child in school, as this can help their child's school to attract additional 'pupil premium' funding to support their learning. Some children whose parents meet the eligibility criteria and whose child attends a school nursery all day can also get a free school meal when they are two, three or four years old.

You can apply for free school meals for your child <u>on our website</u>, and you'll get an instant decision. Or you can call our education helpline on 0345 155 1019.

If you have applied unsuccessfully before and your financial circumstances have since changed, please apply again.

Supermarket vouchers for the school holidays

The financial challenges faced by some families can be intensified during school holidays because of increased costs such as food, especially with the current cost of living, and reduced incomes due to childcare.

We want to make sure that no child in Devon goes hungry in the school holidays, when free school meals are unavailable. We can only do that by using some of the Government's Household Support Fund to help families who receive benefits-related free school meals during term time, to purchase food over the holidays.

Supermarket vouchers worth £45 will be sent to each child currently eligible for free school meals during term time, to spend during the Christmas holiday and February half-term break to replace the meals they would have had at school during the day. More detailed information about our free school meals holiday voucher scheme is available on our website.

Free school holiday activities

Children aged five to 16-years-old who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals are invited to take part in our action-packed Holiday Activities and Food programme.

We've teamed up with over 60 different providers across Devon to offer a great range of free physical activities and healthy, nutritional, hot meals during the school holidays.

Activities including a range of sports and coaching opportunities, indoor and outdoor play activities; magic and circus skills; film making; arts and crafts; music; cooking; theatre workshops; yoga and mindfulness; and a lot more! Some schemes are also offering hampers for the holidays.

Bookings are now open, and details of activities can be <u>found on our interactive map</u>. If your child is <u>eligible to access the programme</u>, simply search for a provider in your area, have a look at their listing to see what they're offering, then when you're ready, book a place with them directly.

Free School Meals

Check if your child can get free school meals and additional funding support.

All children in reception, year 1 and year 2 at state schools in England automatically get free school meals. However, parents and guardians are encouraged to apply for free school meals when they enrol their child in school, as this can help their child's school to attract additional 'pupil premium' funding to support learning. From year 3 onwards, children whose parents are getting any of the following are entitled to free school meals:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).
- Income Support (IS).
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance (IBJSA).
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (IRESA).
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit.
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income that does not exceed £16,190).
- Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment you get for a further 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit).

How to apply

Apply through the <u>Devon Citizens Portal</u>. This is the quickest and easiest way to apply and will result in you getting an instant decision. Alternatively, call the Education Helpline on 0345 155 1019.
