# Maths Mastery Teacher Research Group

## **Gymnastic Superstars**

Who would have thought that a school the size of Holywell could have so many outstanding gymnasts?! On Sunday **Bella Ayres, Lannah Barrow, Lara Heywood and Maddie Wilson** were selected by Falcon's gymnastics Academy to trial for the Devon gymnastics squad. The girls travelled to Exeter to complete the 4 hour, very intense and testing trial process. The girls were measured in their flexibility; strength and skill level and at their first outing have all qualified as part of the Devon gymnastics squad for this year. This in itself sounds an amazing achievement, but the results the girls achieved were even more phenomenal, Lannah was placed 1st and Bella 2nd, not only in age group, but across all of the age ranges and the 43 children that participated in the trial. Their scores were an amazing 30 points clear of the 3rd placed individual in their age group. Such fantastic scores have placed them in the Devon Elite squad, an exceptional achievement for two seven year olds! Lara placed 4th and Maddie 5th in their age category and were 10th and 13th overall. This means that they are now members of the Development section of the Devon gymnastics squad, a rare feat in a first trial attempt for Devon.

A special mention also needs to be given to **Felicity Ayres** who supported all of the girls at the trials and makes the Devon elite squad on the basis of the amazing scores she achieved at last year's trials.

All 5 of the girls will now attend five Devon squad days (including a Summer camp), where they will prepare with their team mates for competitions where they will wear their Devon leotards with pride!

Well done to you all, Holywell is very proud of you and this amazing achievement.
